Clive Staples Lewis, known as Jack, was born in Belfast. He loved to read, write stories and ask a lot of questions! 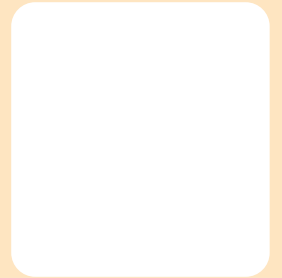

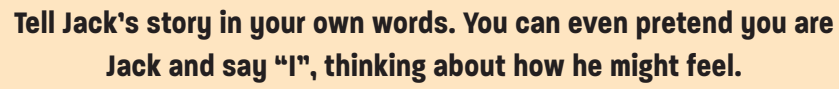

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Family Project: Sharing the Gospel Through Story
