## “Jesus moments”.


These are moments when someone or something in the story is a little bit like **Jesus**.

And the king had said that everyone had to bow before Haman.

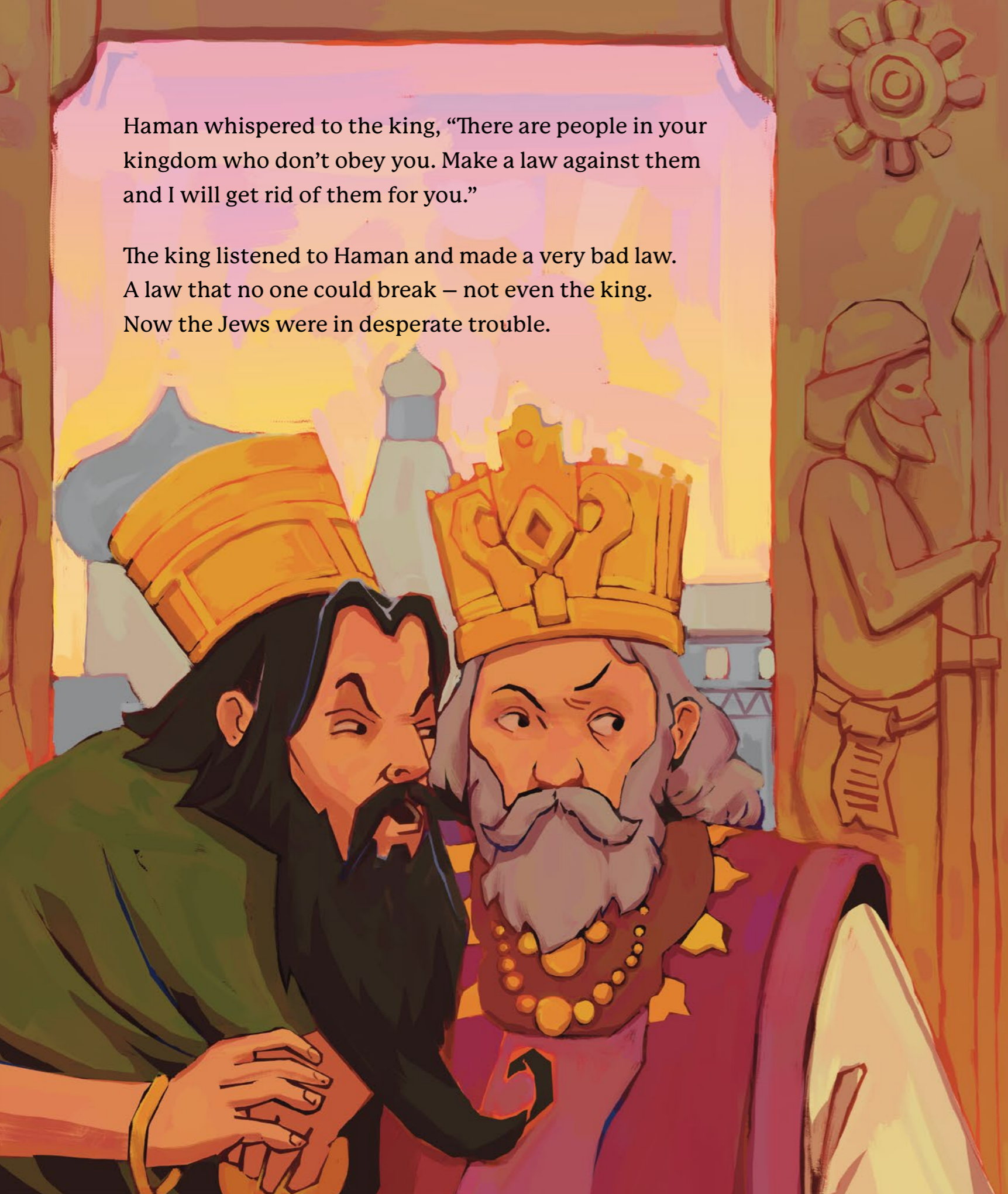
But one man – a Jew called Mordecai – refused. He would not bow, because he knew that Haman hated the Jews. This, of course, made Haman hate the Jews even more.

“I hate them so much,” thought Haman. “In fact, I hate them so much that I want to get rid of them all.”

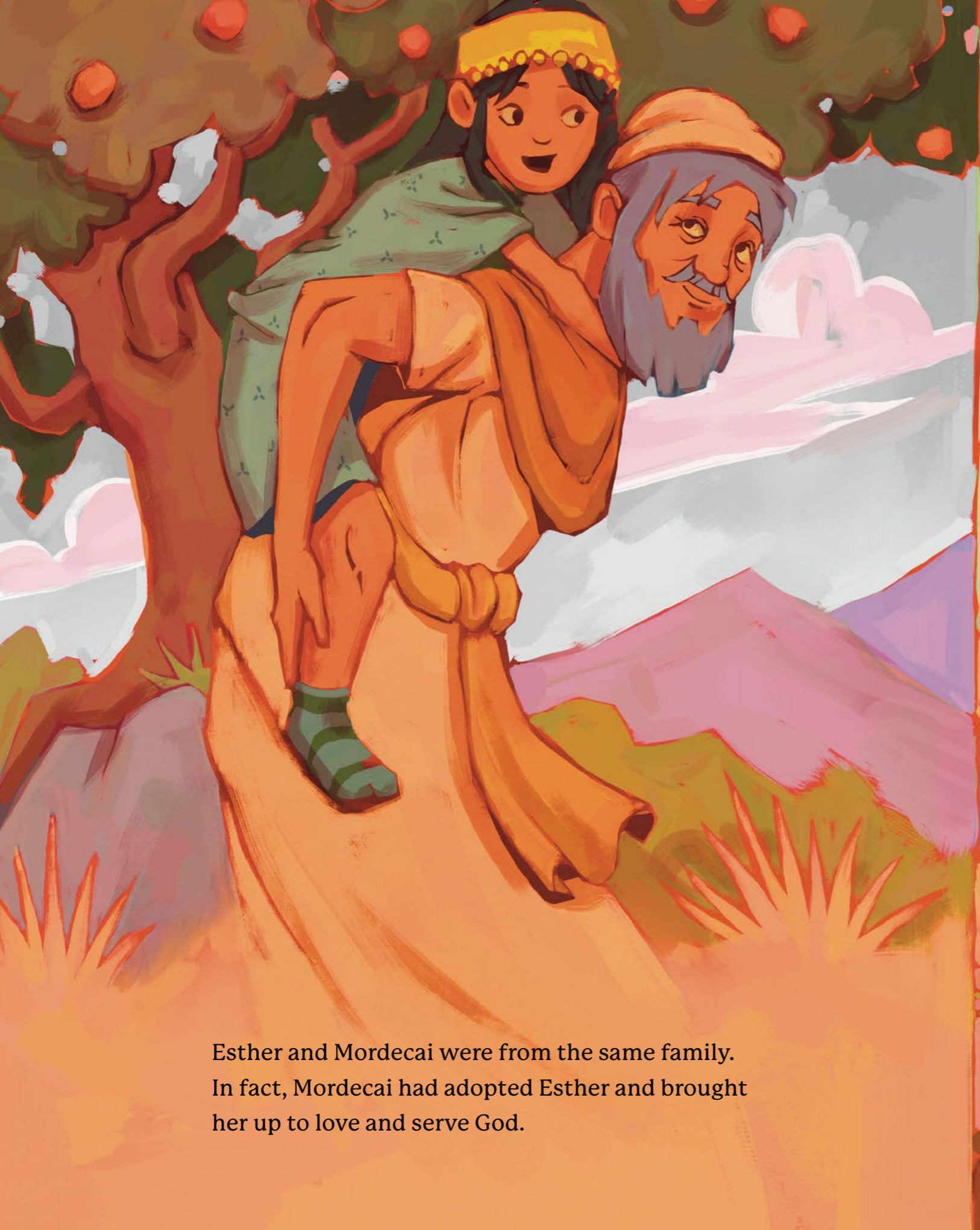
And so he hatched a wicked plot...

But the king didn't know – and neither did Haman – that Esther, the queen, was Jewish.

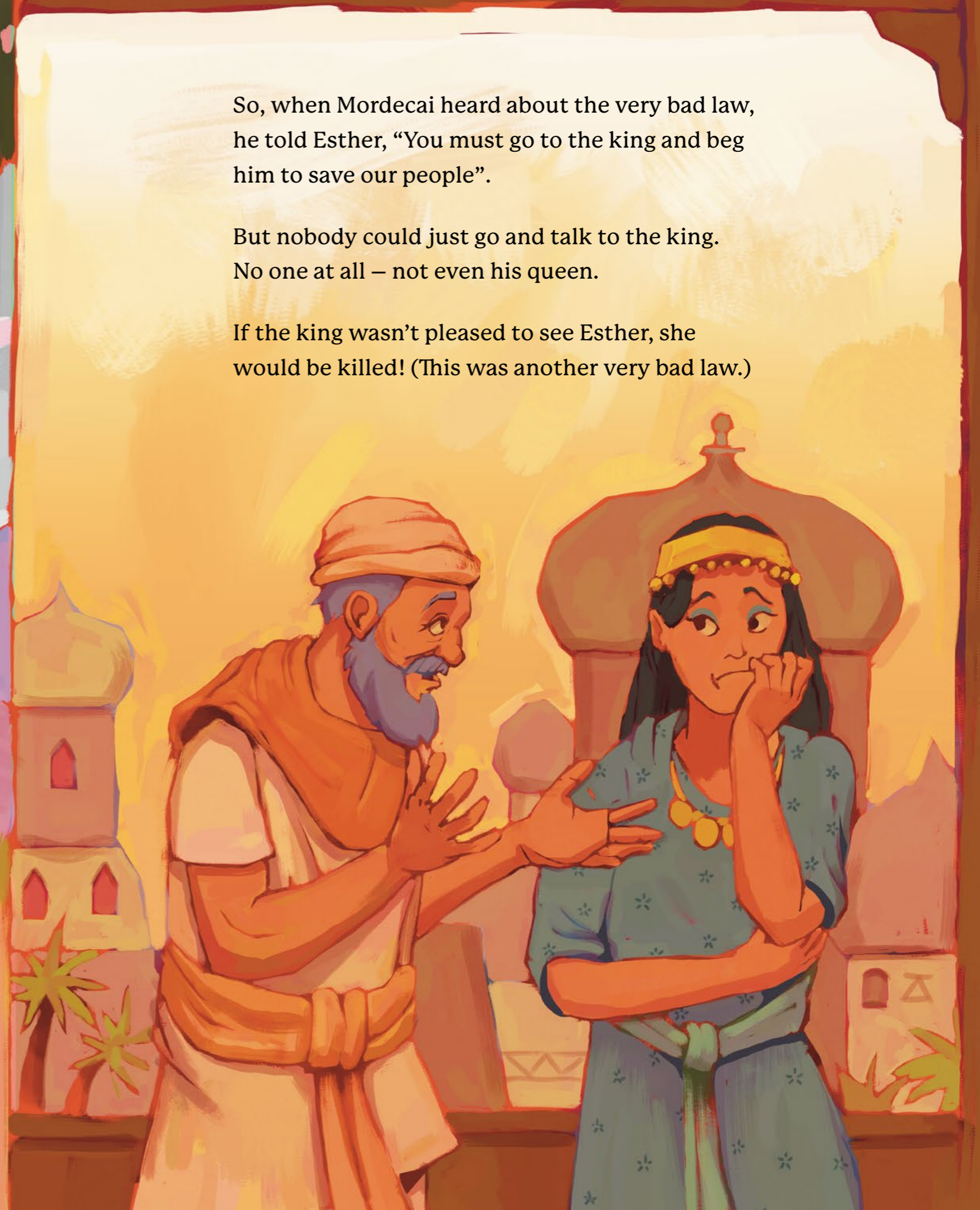


Esther and Mordecai were from the same family. In fact, Mordecai had adopted Esther and brought her up to love and serve God.
