Matthew 21:1-9; Luke 19:28-40




Hundreds of years before Jesus was born, God's messenger Zechariah had said that when God's promise-keeping king came, he would ride into Jerusalem on a young donkey.


Jesus and his friends were near Jerusalem. So he sent two of his disciples to a village. "You will find a young donkey there," he told them. "Untie it and bring it to me."
