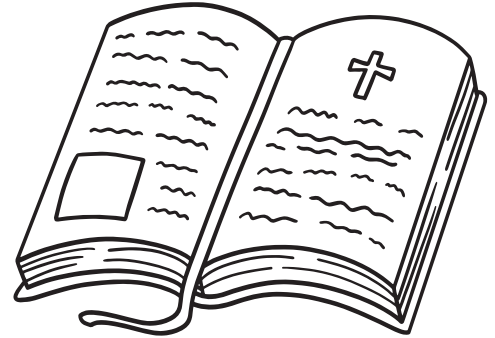

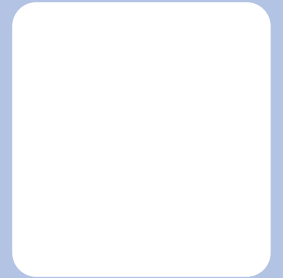

Family Project: The Importance of the Scottish Reformation

John Knox was a leader in the Scottish Reformation. His influence helped to shape the structure and beliefs of the Church of Scotland! He believed that the Bible was the true word of God, and spent his life fighting for people to hear and believe as well.

Day 1: Overview

- A simple definition of the word "reformation" means: to change something for the better.
- Find something small you can change for the better around you - maybe decorate something, or clean something up.
- When you're finished, talk about these questions:
 - Why it was good to make that change?
 - What sorts of things did you have to do?

Day 2: The Church That Needed Changing

- The Scottish Reformation was all about changing the church for the better, to be more like what God says about the church in the Bible.
- What was the Catholic Church doing during John Knox's lifetime? Have a look in his book and maybe online with a trusted grownup. Make a list below.

- Cross out anything on the list that goes against something God says is good in the Bible.

Day 3: John Knox's Part in the Reformation

- John Knox believed in the authority of Scripture and Scripture alone. Why did he believe this? Look at 2 Timothy 3:16-17 and Hebrews 1:1-3.

- Why did reading the Bible make him want to reform?

- Choose a Bible verse to memorize that reminds you that God's word is true and amazing.

Day 4: Being a Follower of Jesus

- John Knox loved the Bible because he could hear what Jesus said and did. What characteristics of Jesus can you see in John's story?

- What do you love about Jesus that makes you want to follow him?

Day 5: Modern Reformation

- Because of sin in the world, there are always things that need reformation. Think of something in your school, community, or church that needs to change for the better. For example, maybe everyone seems to pick on one kid, or maybe there is lots of garbage left behind in the church after Sunday Service.

- Make a list of simple ideas about how you can help change that situation for the better.

- Ask Jesus to help you, and keep your eyes open to other ways you can serve him like John Knox did, by seeing when something isn't the way God says is good and helping to change it for the better.
